



FBI honors Siebel for Meth Project work

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The FBI recently recognized Montana Meth Project creator Thomas Siebel with the Director's Community Leadership Award.

The billionaire software executive created the statewide media campaign, using \$5.6 million of his own money, to try and stop methamphetamine use among 12- to 17-year-olds. The campaign, aimed to show the real consequences of methamphetamine use, kicked off on Sept. 1, 2005. Since then, Idaho, Arizona and Illinois have adopted the campaign.

Special Agent in Charge Timothy Fuhrman, of the Salt Lake City FBI field office, praised Siebel for making "a real difference in the lives of the people of Montana and across the country."
